

As a result, the AutoX Committee decided to turn this into an impromptu Dyno and Dogs and AutoX Awards event.

After the committee meeting, awards were handed out to the top three participants in each class. 

If it applies to the vehicles, then it goes for the lifestyle products too - Solar Charger, Urban Mega Shopper or Laptop Bag: all of them are visionary and ecofriendly, urban and premium, everyday and elegant.

Materials: sustainable & modern.

Leather tanned using olive leaves and a felt-look fabric made from recycled PET- those are the exciting materials from which the BMW i Laptop Bag is made. This bag has blue chord handles – also made from recycled PET – and it bears the signature of BMW i. The strong sleeve protects your computer on the move.

Use it: daily, everywhere.

The BMW i Solar Charger lets you charge, store and dispense energy. This upmarket solar device in a BMW i logo design may be very compact, but it has a big charging surface and harbors an integrated rechargeable battery. It comes with a charging cable that has a range of different slot-on connectors, allowing you to charge mobile devices and MP3 players without burdening resources. If you need faster charging from time to time, then a USB port lets you supply the unit's battery with power without a light source – from a laptop for example.

The BMW i USB Stick helps you transfer data on the move and holds 16 gigabytes inside its matt, aluminum-look body, which features an "electric-blue" BMW i logo.

From a Photographers POV

I should probably start in June of 2007. I made the trek across multiple states and ended at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. There, I experienced my first live automotive sporting event - which also happened to be my first experience with Formula One. I knew nothing of the sport, but by the time the weekend was over - I was in love. That weekend I fell hard for a glamorous sport with equally glamorous drivers.

Since then, I've been to four races around the world and have missed maybe a handful on television. In the meantime I started following multiple types of racing. My passion for photography was easily paired with my new found love of motor sports. So you could imagine my reaction when I learned about the plans of a purpose-built Formula One track in my backyard.

Fast forward to today...

Since the doors were opened in November 2012, I have been to Circuit of the Americas (COTA) nearly a dozen times - and I must say, I find something new to admire each time I'm there. From witnessing Lewis Hamilton pass Sebastian Vettel at Turn 12 in the inaugural United States Grand Prix at COTA to the hot lap in the M5 during the BMWCCA Texas Trifecta - I have not been let down.

COTA offers a variety of elevations, twists, and turns which yield some excellent racing, amazing views for both spectating and photographing. I know that every time I am at the track with my camera, I will have the opportunity to get some cool photos. I've walked the entire track multiple times - in fact usually walk the entire track (yes up Turn 1) at least once

or twice at each event. I've sat in every permanent grand stand, Turn 12 grand stand, and in every general admission section - there isn't a bad seat in the house.

Not only is the circuit itself amazing, but every event has been top notch. Ok, maybe the FormulaRun had some hiccups, but it was the first event ever, and those kinks were ironed out by F1 weekend. I have been highly impressed by each event, and Texas Trifecta was no different. Having roughly 150 drivers, 100 instructors, and 60 racers come together for this three-day event is a major feat. The Lone Star, Houston, and Tejas chapters should feel proud. We all heard horror stories from other groups during their track days, but no such stories were told after this event.

I genuinely hope COTA will continue to host and allow groups to have track days. As a fan of racing, this is a great marketing tool for the circuit. It allows racing enthusiasts to have a taste of what it's like out on the track and in turn (ideally) makes them want to experience a race from the stands. As a photographer, it allows me to be a part of motorsport at the most basic level – just people with a passion for cars. Without the passion – there is no point in photographing anything.
