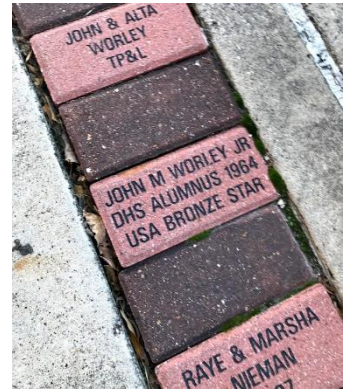


## Gimmick Rally 2021 Answers

12/25/2020

1. Biggar Hat Store (Northwest corner of the square)
2. Chisolm Trail (located on the Northwest and Southwest corners of the Court house, there are metal-pole mounted text)
3. Bart and Lisa “Simpson” of “The Simpsons” would lead to “Simpson & Simpson Attorney at Law” located on the side of the South East building of the square across from The Wright House
4. McMurray and Getty’s (the Building and the History Marker) – across from Sweetie Pie’s is now “BPW Law” – Boyd, Powers Williamson
5. DHS Alumnus 1964 USA Bronze Star: John M Worley Jr – a brick found in front of White Heat on the Southern section of the town square. There are some funny bricks along the way.
6. The Wright House Arts (Southeast of the town square)
7. Decatur was originally going to be called Taylorville – found on the historical marker sign located near Biggar Hats.
8. Missing Element of the Photo: 131; this was on a light pole on the north west corner of the courthouse





9. 2008 – 2 Red Fire hydrants were placed in the north west and the south east corners of the court house. Both have the same origin name of Oskaloosa, Iowa and the same year.
10. Wise County Veterans Memorial Park: Over your shoulder on the left as you start to leave town. You notice a large open area with stone work and plaques.
11. Sign on the right with “Wise Electric Cooperative” on it
12. Hayhurst Brothers Homes Available. Look to the Left on top of a short

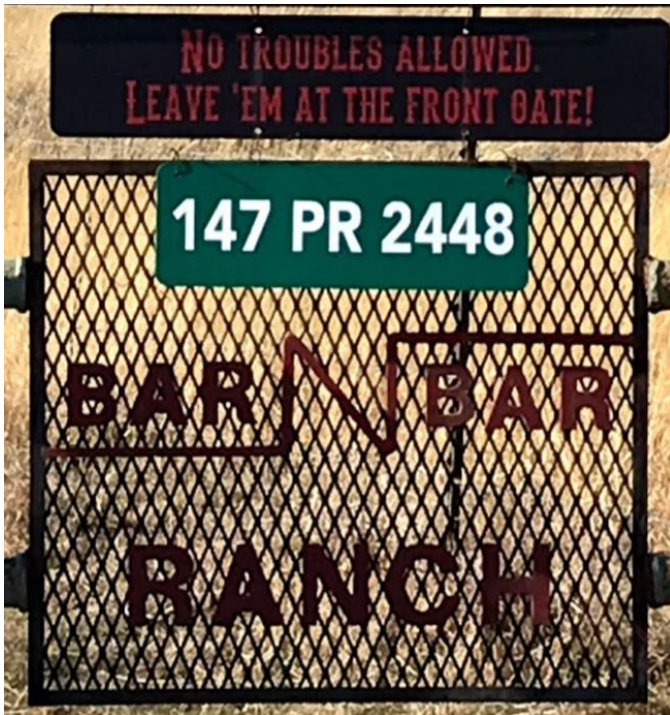


rise in the hill.

13. Black creek and lake and ranch, etc.
14. Goodyear tires – a sign on your left says Goodyear Now Open on a Green sign



15. Joy Wind Ranch 1980; Righthand side of the road – arch over the entry way and a big sign along the road
16. Bar N Bar Ranch: On the left-hand side of the road:



17. Clear Creek Taxidermy – sign straight ahead at the intersection with FM 455 (before you make the left)
18. Forestburg was 8 miles after the turn
19. Historical Marker 586, not well marked, Butterfield Overland Stage Line Crossing
20. It was 2,795 miles long from San Francisco to St. Louis
21. “Seldom” Seen Rd
22. TNT Ranch on the right side of the road – you’ll notice the windmill first and then the name over the entry into the ranch
23. First State Bank is now the Forestburg Historical Museum
24. Dye Mound Road – a green sign pointing to the road just after the turn onto FM-677
25. Soliciting is prohibited without a permit inside of Muenster City Limits
26. Germanfest is the last full weekend in April – the sign on the Northwest corner of US-82 & Main St states this and Oktoberfest 2021 will be Oct 1, 2, and 3.
27. “Laughter is the Best Medicine” – Written on the wall of Doc’s Bar & Grill
28. At Old Theater Mall are a number of businesses: Laura’s Flowers & Tuxedos, Time Traveler Photography, Texas Farm Bureau Insurance, Vickie Cut-N-Up, Studio A and more.
29. Muenster Museum is named after Ken & Aggie Fette Seyler and it shows the hours are Sat 10-4.
30. Adopted by North Town Partners – a road adoption sign just north of town
31. Turtle Hill Golf Course
32. Boots reference is Ostrich; the answer is Blue Ostrich Winery



33. Red River Cycle Trails – on the right side of the road, this is over the entry way as you pass by. This is a dirt bike trail system for those interested.
34. Taovayas Memorial Bridge
35. North on 89 - Oklahoma sign just over the bridge
36. Courtney United Methodist – a white sign just located at the U-turn point
37. Only 18 miles to Nocona – on the big sign at the “T” intersection of 2954 and 677. The green distance sign of 13 is incorrect as that is after the turn has been made.
38. LLL River Ranch – on the right-hand side of the road, multiple places on the Barbwire fence have “LLL River Ranch” on them with a blue background
39. Historical Marker states this was the site of the 1759 Taovaya Victory over Spain – more information regarding the Memorial Bridge you just crossed over.
40. High School shows 1924 in the rock over the top of the school’s name on the left



41. Bonnie Mitchell Rd (a green sign along the route)
42. This historical marker in Granite is hard to read (<https://atlas.thc.texas.gov/>)

#### North Nocona Oil Field

43. Fire was doused by Tex Thornton in 1925.
44. 100,000,000 (100 million) barrels
45. Shamrock



46. 3033 (population of Nocona)

- 47. Horton's car museum
- 48. McNabb Feed Store, Inc. (MFM and Martindale was on top of the building just before US-82)



- 49. Triple "R" Collision – on the Left-hand side of the road as you leave Nocona. If you don't stop and look hard, it looks like Triple B.
- 50. DWI – road side sign on the right side
- 51. Duck at rest: Mallard Cemetery
- 52. Brim Farm – over the entrance to this Ranch-looking place
- 53. Sunset is the name of the next city – identified by the milage sign after you make the turn or before you make the turn
- 54. "K" Line is a Connex box behind someone's house that you can see on the left
- 55. "3-E Storage" just before you get to the 287 intersection
- 56. Hanson Bridgeport Plant – on the left just behind some plants
- 57. Vulcan Materials Company on the right
- 58. At first glance, it looks like Chuck Norris but is actually Chuck Nichols, Inc. Boots, Jackets & Jeans
- 59. Wise Dental on the left
- 60. Maxum sells Petroleum; on the left just after the left-hand curve.
- 61. Welcome to Paradise – the name of the town but at the intersection of Main St and 114, it has the Welcome sign in multi-colors on the right
- 62. Ponds: DFWPonds.com – business on the left side of the road
- 63. South F.M. 51 to Springtown – big green traffic sign
- 64. Silver Bullet Pawn & Gun – business name in Boyd on the right, just past the Allsup's
- 65. The Wild Animal Sanctuary or International Exotic Animal or BigCat.org - Exotic Animal Sanctuary on the left
- 66. TXDOT Test Section TTI (may accept 111 but TTI is the correct value) – blue marker signs on the right side of Eastbound 114 between 287 and FM 156.
